Deuteronomy 6:6-7 – And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise.

In October 1517, an unknown monk in the Saxon area of the Holy Roman Empire (now Germany) named Martin Luther nailed 95 talking points to the church door in Wittenburg. So, began the Lutheran Reformation. For the rest of his life, until 1546, Luther taught that humanity's only source of forgiveness, life, and salvation is given by the grace of Christ Jesus. And further, we only know of His grace by means of the Holy Spirit inspired prophetic and apostolic writings of the Scriptures.

However, in the early 1500s the Scriptures were only available in their original Hebrew, Greek, or Aramaic or in the church-approved Latin translation. The lay person was never given the opportunity to see, let alone read, God's Word. That didn't so much matter, as most of them were illiterate. But then again, most priests and pastors were also illiterate in these ancient languages. Therefore, much of the clergy never read God's Word, either.

Then in 1521, Luther translated the New Testament into the language of the people. His German New Testament was widely published in 1522. Later, in 1523 – 500 years ago this year - Luther's translation of the Pentateuch (Genesis through Deuteronomy) was published for the people to read.

Not since the time of Peter and Paul, had the Church had access to the Word of God in the language of the common people. This reawakening of access to God's Word opened a renewed world to God's people on earth. People could read God's Word for themselves and learn how that Word flowed in, around, and throughout all aspects of their lives. Fathers could once again teach their children the Word of God. Families could talk about God's Word at home, and when they walked through town, and at night as they went to sleep, and as they woke up in the morning. Being able to read God's Word in their own language literally changed their lives.

Today, most of us have not one, but several copies of the Bible in our homes. Many of us have downloaded a Bible app on our phones or tablets. Today, you and I have unbounded, almost unlimited access to the Bible in a plethora of translations and across a variety of platforms.

Do you see what a gift this is?

How much more does God's Word now mean to us than it did to even Moses those 3500 years ago? How much more can we teach our children the very words of our Savior spoken for them? How much more can we live in the history of Moses, sing the songs of David, walk with the teachings of Paul, or bask in the promises of Christ? Give thanks for the incredible Word of God that you hold in your hands. Download the app. Take God's Word with you to work. Listen to it at the gym or in the car. And by all means, bring your Bible with you to church, so that the Holy Spirit can imprint God's Word of forgiveness, life, and salvation in your mind and on your heart.
