# A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

#### "For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord!" Luke 2:11

To be fair, this is mostly a repeat of last year's Christmas message. But it's worth reading again. Because it seems like the older I get, the more life feels like a merry-go-round. I keep coming back to the same spots and having to relearn the same lessons. Too often I feel as though I am ready to move on, only for God to show me that I haven't truly learned the lesson yet. So, with the Advent and Christmas seasons upon us again, let us relearn the true meaning of God's gift to the world.

It's time, once again, for the countless Christmas/holiday specials. Everyone from the kids' Christmas pageant to the national televised Christmas at the Capitol wants to tell you what Christmas is all about. "It's about loving and giving and family and celebrating and tinsel," they say. The Grinch will once again realize, as he does every year, that Christmas doesn't come from a store, that "Christmas, perhaps, means a little bit more."

But just as with last year's specials, each of these holiday insights still leaves us a little bit empty. The Grinch will again think that Christmas "means a little bit more," but once again he will not get to what that "more" is. Instead, he merely brings back the presents and cakes that he stole. He gives. Like the Grinch, we can too easily think of Christmas as an opportunity for us to give: to give of our time, give of our money, give of our love. Yet while our giving is good, that's not what Christmas is about.

Neither is the meaning of Christmas found in the Christian platitude, "Let's put Christ back in Christmas." We take up this phrase in defense against the onslaught of commercialized Christmas. I understand the sentiment and the motivation behind it, but you see, we didn't put Him there in the first place and so we have no power to put Him back.

We can't put Him back because He never left. We did. We did with our busy-ness and our overly scheduled lives. We did by our own sinful pride and anger. We did when we repeatedly walked away from Him. Yet He continues to come back to you and me as He did that first Christmas so long ago, to give us life, forgiveness, and hope. He is the gift that is given for you.

Christmas isn't about what you or I do. Instead, it's about what God has done. Christmas isn't about doing, or giving, or even loving. Because everything that needed to be done for Christmas has been done by the only One who could do it ... the infant in the manger, our Savior, Christ Jesus our Lord. Thank you, our heavenly Father, for teaching this lesson to us once




