No More Sour Grapes! (Ezekiel 18:2)

It seems everyone's a victim in today's world. Personal responsibility has become a byword in our society. "I am the way I am because of the horrible way I was raised by my parents. It's all their fault. They really messed me up." If it's not the parents, it's society's fault or somebody else's just so long as the blame is applied to someone else. Sour grapes!

Not much has changed. The 6th century BC citizens of Judah had pretty much the same buck-passing mindset. The prophet Ezekiel, among others, is busy prophesying impending judgment and doom. In fact, the first 24 chapters of his prophecy contain almost nothing but visions, symbolic acts, and oracles portending judgment against God's people. Babylon, the appointed sword of God's wrath, is unsheathed and poised to strike. So, the inhabitants of Jerusalem race to pin the blame on their parents. "The fathers eat sour grapes and the children's teeth are set on edge," says the popular proverb.

Every good lie contains a large kernel of truth. Every individual's sinful proclivities are literally inherited from the father. The Church calls this original sin. The results of original sin are expressed in the addendum to the first commandment: "I, YAHWEH your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me." And, of course, experience bears this out. If the parents are ne'er-do-wells, the more likely the kids will be. And it generally just gets worse with each successive generation.

But none of this excuses the individual. YAHWEH God speaks of personal responsibility in spades in Ezekiel 18 – "The soul who sins is the one who will die." No more sour grapes! But the good news is that repentance can break the chain. Through the prophet, God lays out the example of three generations of men. The man in the middle is an unrepentant sinner, but both his father and his son are righteous in God's eves because neither does what he does. They both look to God and live. The chain is broken.

With every oracle of judgment, God also promises deliverance and restoration for those He will bring to repentance. This case is no exception. In fact, the judgment and deliverance cycle predicted by Ezekiel for Jerusalem both prepares the way for and foreshadows the ultimate chain breaking work of the Messiah. His cross would be the ultimate cycle of judgment and deliverance, the ultimate pronouncement by God, "no more sour grapes." The cross judges us, telling us to stop blaming our parents. We are responsible! But it also delivers us, because, on it, Messiah himself consumes the sour grapes of the wine of God's wrath.
