## March 2024 Newsletter

It's so good to be with you all at Zion and officially installed now to boot! I find it very cool that my Stateside ministry career is being bookended with calls to Zion – first in Hillsboro MO and now here. Did you know that the etymological root of the Hebrew place name *Tzion* (ציון) means *marked* as in *marked out* or designated for a set purpose. How appropriate!

Just for kicks, I decided to do an English language search on the word *marked* in the BBE (the Bible in Basic English) because it likes to use the generic term to cover all of the markings of people by the Lord, including the very frequent literal use of the word *marked* and the equally frequent conceptual use, *anointed*, which of course is a very literal and physical marking for a set purpose. In Scripture, I found 70 such refences to people being marked out by God – 34 in the Old Testament and 36 in the new. In both testaments, God marks out individuals, groups, and entire people groups or nations.

Regarding nations or peoples, the OT contains 6 such promises – 3 to Israel, 1 to the Gentiles, 1 to the circumcised, and 1 to a holy remnant both temporally and eschatologically (in the end times). Groups in the OT meanwhile are marked out 13 times – the priesthood 8 times, the Levites twice, the heads of families or clans twice, and the servants before the Ark of the Covenant one time. Individuals in the OT are marked and set aside for service in the kingdom 16 times – the king 11 times, the High Priest 3 times, and the Messiah/Jesus twice. The king gets so many references because David refers to Saul as God's anointed one or, according to the BBE, *the one marked with holy oil*, seven times.

In the New Testament, entire nations or peoples are marked and set aside 26 times -25 times believers in general and once specifically the Gentiles. Paul, the first missionary, goes crazy talking about believers being marked out by God -16 of those 25 references are in his letters. A group is marked only once in the NT - the eyewitnesses to the Resurrection. Finally, an individual is marked and set aside 9 times -5 times Jesus is, twice the Apostle Paul is, once Saul and Barnabas are, and once the  $12^{th}$  Apostle Matthias.


