Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted.

#### - Hebrews 12:1-3

The theme for our 2024-2025 school year at Zion is ENDURE. Running the race of life can be trying at times. We will all hit bumps along the road. Some bumps are small: a bad grade, a fender-bender, a neverending house project. But some bumps are bigger: a cancer diagnosis, a house fire, the loss of a loved one.

But I know someone who does. Jesus was faced with the cross, where He knew there would be great pain and suffering. He knew that His closest disciples would abandon Him. He knew the hostility He would endure at the hands of the very people He had come to save. Yet knowing all this He looked at the cross with JOY. Joy because He knew that through the cross, He would reunite a fallen humanity to our loved Father and Creator.

It's by His strength that we endure. And in Him, we not only endure, but we rejoice in the suffering that is before us. We rejoice not only in the Christ-given ability to face the bumps in the road, but also in the fact that we are not running the race alone. We endure with Christ Jesus. We endure with that great cloud of witnesses who came before us. And we endure with one another. You see, Jesus not only connected us to our Father God, but He connected us to the church of yesterday, today, and tomorrow.

Through this school year, ENDURE. Endure with joy in the knowledge that you are not alone. Endure with trust in a God who loves you through His Son Jesus Christ. Endure with hope that in Christ every weight and sin will be cast aside on that day when you and I finish the race.

# Knowing Growing Serving

One of the community ministries of Zion Lutheran Church is through Cornerstone Rescue Mission. CRM is privately funded, non-denominational, tax-exempt non-profit that daily serves the physical and spiritual needs of the poverty-stricken and homeless of our community. They have effectively done so for many years. Most of their support for this work comes from individual donors. Many of those served have gone on to lead fulfilling, independent lives and contribute back to the community in many ways.

Our ministry to the CRM community is to prepare and serve meals monthly. We are one of several groups that volunteer to do this. A small group from Zion, headed by Bill and Ruth Kudera prepare and serve supper every 2nd Wednesday and 5th Monday of the month. Each month Bill and Ruth plan, purchase, and prepare delicious and nutritious meals to feed approximately 100 people at approximate \$1.00, or less, per serving. Approximately 25 man-hours are given each meal by Bill, Ruth, and the rest of their team. A meal usually consists of a main course, such as chicken or meatloaf, a couple of sides, (perhaps mashed potatoes and green beans), buttered bread, salad, and an assortment of desserts. Feeding South Dakota helps keep costs down by providing food at a very reduced cost, but groceries must still be supplemented with some items bought on the open market.

The cost is, of course, a great concern. This ministry to provide meals is not a line item in our church budget, but is supported by 1/3 of our Thanksgiving Day offering, and also by your gifts designated for this purpose. One way Thrivent members can help is by applying for a Thrivent Action Team grant to donate to this ministry. Consider speaking to your Thrivent representative about ways that funds can be provided. Every contribution makes a difference in a life.

We pray that we are a blessing to the people at Cornerstone in more than just feeding their stomachs. In preparing and serving this meal, we show that we care about them. They love to see our group coming, because it means a very satisfying meal served by people who smile and greet them. We receive words of gratitude and blessing from many of these hungry people. We try to "be like Jesus with skin on" in order to remind them of His love.
